Minutes

The Board of Education Business Meeting was called to order by President Ned Deuel at 4:30 p.m. in the District Board Room, 725 Harrison Street.

Present: President Ned Deuel, Commissioners Calvin Corriders, Dorothy Matthews, Nancy McCarty, Laurie Menkin and Kim Rohadfox-Ceaser
Absent: Commissioner Cynthia Kirby

A motion was made by Commissioner Kim Rohadfox-Ceaser and seconded by Commissioner Corriders to enter into executive session. Vote on the motion: 6-Yes, 0-No (Commissioner Kirby absent), motion carried.

The Board of Education entered into executive session (to discuss matters of personnel and negotiations) at 4:32 p.m.

Commissioner Kirby arrived at 4:33 p.m.

The Board of Education reconvened from executive session at 5:41 p.m. President Deuel invited those present to join the Pledge of Allegiance.

Minutes of Previous Meetings

A motion was made by Commissioner Rohadfox-Ceaser and seconded by Commissioner Matthews to accept the minutes as printed. Vote on the motion: 7-Yes, 0-No, motion carried.

Consideration of Accounts

- Financial Statement and Audit Summary Report

A motion was made by Commissioner Kirby and seconded by Commissioner Matthews to accept the Financial Report and Audit Summary as presented. A roll call vote on the motion: 7-Yes, 0-No, motion carried.

President Deuel announced the process by which those who wished to address the Board of Education on an agenda or non-agenda item may do so. Those who addressed the Board on agenda and non-agenda items: Susan Roczen, Susan O'Neil, Kimberlee Knauf, Ann O'Hara, Carol Halter, Diane Kucharski, Steve Alleyne and Anne Marie Voutsinas spoke to Board about settling the contract for Units 7, 8 and 10.

Pamela Percival of Parents for Public Schools is enthusiastic about the proposed District/City Partnership. Kevin Brown encouraged equity in District decision-making and to consider the effect it will have on students.

Reports

President's Report- The Refrigerator Door Club are actively asking for volunteers and soliciting donations and school supplies for its annual Helping Hands School Supplies Giveaway project. On Thursday, January 24th in order to honor Dr. Martin Luther King, volunteers will stand at the close of school at Clary Middle School to give away bags of school supplies to students.

Superintendent's Report- Corcoran High School student Sheamus Kirst placed first in the High School Division of the NAAPID Oratorical Contest. He was presented a check at the Board Meeting for \$300.

Discussion Items:

Central New York School Board Association will sponsor a Legislative Breakfast on February 9th. The speaker will be Dr. Rick Timbs. The topic will be Statewide School Finance Consortium. Board Members suggested making a presentation on the consortium at the February 13th Board Meeting, followed by a 2008-09 budget presentation. The meeting may be moved to another building. The community will be encouraged to come.

Personnel – Certified

- A. Resolved: That the appointments, transfers, resignations, salary adjustments, leaves of absence, et al, contained in the teaching personnel section of this agenda, as recommended by the Superintendent of Schools, be, and are hereby approved.
- The Superintendent certifies that the requirements of the New York State Education Department and the Board of Education had been met in all cases.
- B. Whereas: Section 2573(5) of the Education Law of the State of New York provides that, at the expiration of the probationary term of any persons appointed for such term, the Superintendent of Schools shall make a written report to the Board of Education recommending for permanent appointment those persons who have been found competent, efficient, and satisfactory; and
- Whereas: the Superintendent of Schools for the Syracuse City School District has furnished a written personnel report containing the names of those persons whom he recommends for permanent appointment as employees in the Syracuse City School District; and
- Whereas: this Board of Education has duly considered said personnel report and the recommendations contained therein; now, therefore, be it
- Resolved: That the teachers recommended for appointment to permanent tenure in the aforementioned personnel report dated January 16, 2008 receive a permanent appointment on tenure in their respective tenure areas with the Syracuse City School District effective on the date indicated and hold such during good behavior and efficient and competent service; and be it further
- Resolved: That this resolution shall take effect immediately.

Resolution-#0108-100

1. RALLY/Contact Community Services Contract

Whereas: the Syracuse City School District has had a long and beneficial Relationship with the Responsive Advocacy for Life and Learning Program (RALLY), and Contact Community Services, and

Whereas: RALLY has offered their services to the District in partnership with Contact Community Services and McClean Hospital Corporation for the 2007/2008 school year; and

Whereas: the District is desirous of continuing to provide alternative services under the RALLY Program, which includes counseling services to seventh and eighth grade classes at Blodgett Middle School in order to prevent homebound instruction placement, and

Whereas: McClean Hospital Corporation will provide RALLY training services including monthly consultation with staff and teachers, on-site consultation and training, materials and support services as needed; and

Whereas: Contact Community Services will provide RALLY Prevention Practitioners with stipend payments, conference and travel reimbursement program and program supplies and payment to training consultants; and

Whereas: as a result of these contracts, Syracuse University will provide social work interns for all classes participating in the RALLY program aimed at improving student achievement and behavior; and

Whereas: the Director of Pupil Services has reviewed and supports the proposed contract; now, therefore, be it

Resolved: That the Superintendent of Schools be, and is hereby authorized, to execute a Contract with McClean Hospital Corporation for the RALLY Program in the amount of \$8,000 and Contact Community Services for \$18,500 for the period of September 1, 2007 to June 30, 2008. This

will be funded from account number A.28250.445.Y7.001460

A motion was made by Commissioner Corriders and seconded by Commissioner Rohadfox-Ceaser to adopt the above resolution. Vote on the motion: 7-Yes, 0-No, motion carried.

Resolution-#0108-101

2. STEP Program/Contact Community Services Contract

Whereas: the Syracuse City School District understands the need to support struggling students in grades 3 thru 6, and understands that early intervention is key in helping students to be successful throughout their school careers, and

Whereas: an intervention program providing short term educational and long term family and student support is desirous, and the Success Through Early Prevention model (STEP) has shown to be effective for students in grades four and five, and

Whereas: the Board of Education recognizes the STEP program has been successful in its goal to provide short term intervention, and support for students when they return to their home school, and

Whereas: the Syracuse City School District expanded the STEP classes from grades 4 and 5 to include grades 3 and 6 beginning in the 2007-08 school year, and

Whereas: Contact Community Services hired a STEP Project Director to coordinate the four STEP programs, and

Whereas: Contact Community Services also hired, trained, and supported four site Coordinators to provide program coordination and ease transition for students and their families, and

Whereas: Contact Community Services also hired four Youth Advocates who work with each student and their family, and provide professional development for all program staff, materials, supplies, mileage and other support as necessary, and

Whereas: Contact Community Services will also evaluate the continued effectiveness of STEP including the long term impact on student behavior and achievement; now, therefore, be it

Resolved: That the Superintendent of Schools be, and is hereby authorized to execute a contract with Contact Community Services for \$299,000.00 for the period of September 1, 2007 through August 30, 2008 funded by budget # A.22100.445.DW.001760.

A motion was made by Commissioner Menkin and seconded by Commissioner Corriders to adopt the above resolution. Vote on the motion: 7-Yes, 0-No, motion carried.

Resolution-#0108-102

3. Legislative Afterschool Funding

Whereas: the Syracuse City School District received a \$1,100,000 legislative grant from the New York State Assembly; and

Whereas: these funds are to support afterschool and enrichment activities for students District-wide; and

Whereas: these funds were directed by the New York State Education Department to be classified as general funds; and

Whereas: a component of the grant is to collaborate with community partners; and

Whereas: partnership agreements and programs have been developed with these community partners as follows:

Peaceful Resolutions for Living (\$227,000)

- Quadrant II Character Education Programming (\$167,000)
- Peaceful Clubs (\$60,000)

YMCA (\$86,573)

- Afterschool enrichment and tutorial at Elmwood School (\$29,097)
- Afterschool enrichment and tutorial at Van Duyn School (\$27,476)
- Afterschool enrichment and tutorial at Roberts School (\$30,000)

Whereas: the Superintendent of Schools and Chief Financial Officer have approved of these agreements; therefore, be it

Resolved: That the Board of Education authorizes payments to Peaceful Resolutions for Living in an amount not to exceed \$167,000, and the YMCA in an amount not to exceed \$86,573 to be paid from budget line A.21100.466.DW.002820

A motion was made by Commissioner Matthews and seconded by Commissioner Rohadfox-Ceaser to adopt the above resolution. Vote on the motion: 7-Yes, 0-No, motion carried.

Resolution-#0108-103

4. Legislative Consulting Contract

Whereas: the Board of Education has recognized the importance of retaining an organization to perform governmental relations and lobbying services for issues involving New York State government, and

Whereas: the Board of Education, wishes to retain Wilson, Elser, Moskowitz, Edelman & Dicker for the period of January 1, 2008 to December 31, 2008; for a fee not to exceed \$25,000.00 to be paid in 12 monthly installments of \$2,083.33 from budget line A.14800.445, and

Whereas: the Board of Education will receive periodic updates from Wilson, Elser, Moskowitz, Edelman & Dicker, which shall occur not less than once per quarter; now therefore, be it

Resolved: The Board of Education hereby authorizes payment by the Chief Financial Officer to Wilson, Elser, Moskowitz, Edelman & Dicker, for any and all payments allocable to said organization subject to sufficient funds being available in budget line A.14800.445; and be it further

Resolved: That payments required under the agreement with Wilson, Elser, Moskowitz, Edelman & Dicker will be made between January 1, 2008 and December 31, 2008.

A motion was made by Commissioner Rohadfox-Ceaser and seconded by Commissioner Matthews to adopt the above resolution. Vote on the motion: 7-Yes, 0-No, motion carried.

Resolution-#0108-104

5. Create Two (2) Teaching Positions (PLATO Recovery Program)

Whereas: the Syracuse City School District is committed to providing all students with appropriate

educational services, and

- Whereas: the District recognizes the importance of re-engaging students who have temporarily left school, and who are still committed to earning a Syracuse City School District High School Diploma, and
- Whereas: students currently enrolled in Fowler High School, as well as Beard and Carnegie Alternative Programs, have little opportunity to retake failed courses outside of summer programming, and
- Whereas: this results in students falling behind academically, which leads to a greater likelihood of them leaving school prior to graduation, and
- Whereas: the Board of Education supports the creation of a Twilight Credit Recovery Center, located at the Johnson Center, which will offer students the use of the PLATO Credit Recovery programming, and
- Whereas: the PLATO Credit Recovery programming will also be offered at Beard and Carnegie Alternative Programs and at Fowler High School to meet the needs of the students enrolled, and
- Whereas: a teacher is needed to support the PLATO Credit Recovery program at the Johnson Center and a teacher is needed to support the program at Fowler High School, and
- Whereas: the PLATO Credit Recovery Program was reviewed by the Board of Education Curriculum Committee as part of the Alternative Programs recommendations at their November 20, 2007 meeting, and
- Whereas: the need for 2 teachers to support the PLATO Credit Recovery Program was reviewed at the Board of Education Budget and Finance Committee on December 18, 2007; now, therefore, be it
- Resolved: That the Board of Education approves the hiring of two teachers, at a salary of \$55,000 each; one for the Johnson Center under budget #A.22800.135, and one for Fowler High School under budget #A.21100.135, to support the implementation of the PLATO Credit Recovery Program.

A motion was made by Commissioner McCarty and seconded by Commissioner Corriders to adopt the above resolution. Vote on the motion: 7-Yes, 0-No, motion carried.

Resolution-#0108-05

6. Create One (1) Position-ESL Teacher (Bellevue & Dr. Weeks)

- Whereas: there has been an increase in ESL students entering the Syracuse City School District since the beginning of the school year, and
- Whereas: it is necessary to add additional ESL services at Bellevue Middle School and Dr. Weeks Elementary, and
- Whereas: it is necessary to hire a full time ESL teacher to offer these services to our students at

Bellevue Middle School (.6) and at Dr. Weeks Elementary (.4), and

Whereas: this position was reviewed by the Syracuse City School District Budget and Finance Committee on December 18, 2007; now, therefore, be it

Resolved: That the Board of Education create a position for a 1.0 ESL teacher, at a total cost of \$70,174 including employee benefits, who will be split as follows: .6 at Bellevue Middle School, funded from budget line A.21100.130, and .4 at Dr. Weeks Elementary, funded from budget line A.21100.120.

A motion was made by Commissioner Rohadfox-Ceaser and seconded by Commissioner Matthews to table the above resolution. Vote on the motion: 7-Yes, 0-No, motion carried.

Resolution-#0108-106

7. Create Two (2) Assistant Director of Personnel Positions

Whereas: the Personnel Department is being reorganized to provide services more efficiently and effectively, and

Whereas: the new reorganization will provide a more effective and accurate communication system within the Budget and Payroll Departments, and

Whereas: in order to implement the new system in the Personnel Department there is a need to create two (2) Assistant Director positions in addition to the current position of Assistant Director of Personnel; and

Whereas: the new reorganization will include an Assistant Director of Personnel for Elementary Education, an Assistant Director of Personnel for Secondary Education and an Assistant Director of Personnel for Civil Service; therefore, be it

Resolved: That the Board of Education, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, creates two (2) positions of Assistant Director for Personnel with a cost of \$78,196 each plus benefits effective January 16, 2008. The positions will be funded from A.14300.150.Y4.000000.

A motion was made by Commissioner Matthews and seconded by Commissioner Menkin to adopt the above resolution. Vote on the motion: 7-Yes, 0-No, motion carried.

Resolution-#0108-107

8. Create One (1) .5 Custodial Worker Position for Pre-K Program

Whereas: the Facilities Department has identified a need for additional Custodial Workers; and

Whereas: the Pre-K program has expressed a need for additional cleaning at its Pre-K out source sites and its office complex now; therefore, be it

Resolved: That the Board of Education, upon recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, create an additional .5 FTE Custodial Worker position to clean all Pre-K off District sites and the Pre-K office complex at an estimated cost of \$16,250, including employee benefits, to be funded from budget line F.08511.164.UP.

A motion was made by Commissioner Menkin and seconded by Commissioner Rohadfox-Ceaser to adopt the above resolution. Vote on the motion: 6-Yes, 1-abstain (Commissioner Matthews abstained), motion carried.

Resolution-#0108-108

9. Create Two (2) .5 Custodial Worker Positions

Whereas: the Facilities Department has identified a need for additional Custodial Workers; and

Whereas: the greatest need currently is at Roberts School and the Johnson Center now; therefore, be it

Resolved: That the Board of Education, upon recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, create two (2) additional .5 FTE Custodial Worker positions, one (1) to be added to the staff at Roberts School and one (1) to be added to the Johnson Center staff at an estimated cost of \$32,500 for the 2 positions, including employee benefits, to be funded from budgets A.16200.164.42 (Roberts) and F.08381.164.54.000530 (Johnson Center).

A motion was made by Commissioner McCarty and seconded by Commissioner Kirby to table the above resolution. Vote on the motion: 6-Yes, 1-Abstain (Commissioner Matthews abstained), motion carried.

Resolution-#0108-109

10. Create New Position-Custodial Supervisor

Whereas: the District is on the verge of starting its District-wide Reconstruction Project; and

Whereas: the Assistant Superintendent of Building and Grounds has been reassigned to perform the duties formerly performed by the Superintendent of Maintenance and to oversee the Custodial Department now; therefore, be it

Resolved: That the Board of Education, upon recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, hereby approves the creation of a Custodial Supervisor position to perform the daily duties of managing the Custodial Department at an estimated cost of \$ 65,000, including employee benefits, to be funded from budget number A.16200.150.56.

A motion was made by Commissioner Rohadfox-Ceaser and seconded by Commissioner McCarty to adopt the above resolution. Vote on the motion: 7-Yes, 0-No, motion carried.

Resolution-#0108-110

11. Superintendent of Facilities Maintenance - Salary Increase

Whereas: the District is on the verge of starting its District-wide Reconstruction Project; and

Whereas: it has been stated that Facilities needs additional staff to handle the work load now; therefore, be it

Resolved: That the Superintendent of Facilities Maintenance be reassigned to assist the Facilities Department in overseeing the Phase I renovations; and, be it further

Resolved: That the Board of Education authorize, upon recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, the Superintendent of Facilities Maintenance receive an additional \$3,500 added to his current salary for assuming these duties to be funded from A.16210.112.56.

A motion was made by Commissioner Rohadfox-Ceaser and seconded by Commissioner McCarty to adopt the above resolution. Vote on the motion: 7-Yes, 0-No, motion carried.

Resolution-#0108-111

12. Revise Calendar Digest

Whereas: On June 13, 2007 the Board of Education approved the School Calendar Digest for 2007-2008; and

Whereas: Staff members from the Personnel Department and the Instruction Division met with members of the Syracuse Teachers Association (STA) and the Syracuse Association of Administrators

(SAAS) to modify said School Calendar Digest for 2007-2008 ; and

Whereas: the Board of Education has reviewed said modifications to the School Calendar Digest for purposes of ratification of said Calendar; and now, therefore, be it

Resolved: That this Board of Education hereby ratifies the terms of said School Calendar Digest; and be it further

Resolved: That the Superintendent of Schools be and hereby is authorized to execute said School Calendar Digest on behalf of the Syracuse City School District.

Resolution-#1207-90

13. Revise Policy #5140-Entrance Age

Whereas: children who reach their fifth birthday on or before December 1st of the year of matriculation are entitled to attend school and may be admitted to kindergarten; and,

Whereas: once a child has enrolled in kindergarten, they may opt out prior to December 1st; and now let it be

Resolved: That the Board of Education, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, hereby adopts the changes to Policy #5140, *Entrance Age*, stating that if a kindergarten student is enrolled after December 1st, they must attend school.

A motion was made by Commissioner McCarty and seconded by Commissioner Matthews to take the above resolution off the table. Vote on the motion: 7-Yes, 0-No, motion carried. Whereas: the Syracuse City School District is committed to seeking supplemental programmatic funding; and

Whereas: program proposals have been delivered in concert with the respective and appropriate Syracuse City School District staff members; therefore, be it

Resolved: That the Superintendent of Schools be, and is hereby, authorized to seek funds from appropriate agencies on behalf of the Syracuse City School District for the following proposed projects/programs:

- Teaching American History

15. Consultancies Over \$5,000

Whereas: the Syracuse City School District is committed to providing the highest quality professional services to support our instructional program; and

Whereas: program proposals have been developed in concert with the appropriate Syracuse City School District staff; therefore be it

Resolved: That the Board of Education approves the use of the following consultant as detailed on the attached report for the purposes specified.

16. Naval Reserve Officers Training Corps

Whereas: the Naval Junior Reserve Officers Training Corps (NJROTC) instills in students the value of citizenship, leadership, service, personal responsibility and a sense of accomplishment, and

Whereas: the NJROTC programs have evidenced a positive influence on student attendance, graduation rate, decreased gang involvement, decreased discipline problems, increased self-esteem and have provided students with new educational opportunities, and

Whereas: the NJROTC programs have evidenced a positive influence on communities through increased parent involvement and community service; now, therefore, be it

Resolved That the Board of Education approves of the Syracuse City School District agreement to partner with the NJROTC program at George W. Fowler High School pending receipt, review and approval of the NJROTC/SCSD contract.

17. Spring In-Service Courses

Whereas: the Board of Education adopted the Syracuse City School District Professional Development Plan on December 20, 2000 and the revised plan on August 29, 2001, July 17 2002, June 18, 2003, July 14, 2004, August 11, 2005, August 9, 2006 and October 2007 respectively; and

Whereas: the Professional Development Plan was adopted to address the requirements of the Commissioner's regulations by developing a plan to support educators in preparing students to meet or exceed the New York State Learning Standards and local curricula expectations; and

Whereas: the adopted plan aligns with the Syracuse City School District goals, focus areas and contractual agreements; and

Whereas: the Professional Development Subcommittee of the Syracuse Teacher Center Policy Board has reviewed the applications for in-service proposals to support the implementation of the Syracuse City School District Professional Development Plan; now, therefore be it

Resolved: That the in-service education course proposals recommended by the Professional Development Subcommittee of the Syracuse Teacher Center Policy Board, as set forth in the listing submitted by its chairperson be, and is hereby approved for offering during the spring of 2008; and, be it further

Resolved: That the Teacher Center will follow all guidelines relative to the payment of instructors and granting of salary credit and it shall be the same as those set forth in the terms and conditions of the Unit 1, 2, 8 and 10 current Collective Bargaining Agreements.

18. SU Courses

Whereas: Syracuse University is recognized for collegiate-level programs and has designed DRA 100, Introduction to Playwriting for Non-Majors, DRA 105, Introduction to Acting for Non-Majors, and HTW 221, Health Promotion Across the Life Span, and

Whereas: these three courses will be offered in the spring of 2008, all on the Syracuse University campus, which will promote a challenging and rigorous instructional program for advanced learning; now, therefore, be it

Resolved: That DRA 100, Introduction to Playwriting for Non-Majors, DRA 105, Introduction to Acting for Non-Majors, and HTW 221, Health Promotion Across the Life Span be adopted for high school elective credit beginning in the spring of the 2007-08 school year.

19. Syracuse Center of Excellence Partnership

Whereas: the Syracuse Center of Excellence has expressed an interest in entering into a partnership with the Syracuse City School District; and

Whereas: the partnership will be of great benefit as the District proceeds with its ten year renovation plan, particularly in the area of LEED design and the use of alternate fuel sources for energy now; therefore, be it

Resolved: That the Board of Education authorizes the Superintendent of Schools to enter into a partnership agreement with the Syracuse Center of Excellence at a cost of \$2,000.00, which will be returned to the District in the form of a grant for arts and music.

As there was no additional business to come before the Board of Education, President Deuel called for a motion to adjourn. A motion was made by Commissioner Rohadfox-Ceaser and seconded by Commissioner Corriders to adjourn the meeting. Vote on the motion: 7-Yes, 0-No, motion carried.
