#### Goal

Our goal is to provide all PreK-12 grade students in-person instruction five days a week.

Remote instruction will be provided to students with a documented immunocompromised system or mental health illness.

#### **Vaccination - Staff**

According to the CDC, vaccination is the leading public prevention strategy to end COVID-19.



- We will continue to encourage staff to get vaccinated.
- Staff will have to provide documentation of vaccination or submit to weekly testing for COVID-19.
- County Executive has issued Local Emergency Order #22.
- Working on providing COVID-19 tests at schools.



#### **Vaccination - Students**

#### Children Ages 12+

• We will continue to encourage our families with children ages 12 and up to get vaccinated.



#### **Vaccine Clinics**

 We will continue to partner with local pharmacies to hold Pfizer vaccination clinics in schools.



## Screening for COVID-19

We will continue to work with Onondaga County Health Department to do screening testing in the schools.

- Current OCHD plan is to conduct randomized saliva pool testing
- A consent form will be given to the students the first day of school for parent/guardian authorization for testing.





# Masking in Schools and District Buildings

The Center for Disease Control, the American Academy of Pediatrics, the Onondaga County Health Department, and the CNY Pediatric Group recommend indoor masking including teachers, staff, students and visitors regardless of vaccination status.

- Masks will also be required on buses.
- Masks will be optional outside for recess.
- We will provide masks breaks during the day.
- Masks will be available for students and staff.





## Physical Distancing

We will follow the guidance from CDC to maintain 3 feet of social distance.

- We have polycarbonate dividers available and strongly encourage use in classrooms.
- We will continue to monitor the transmission rate in the county and city and adjust based on the Onondaga County Health Department recommendations.





### Mitigation Measures

We will continue to do temperature screenings daily for students, staff and visitors.

#### Continue to reinforce:


- proper use of masks
- proper hand washing
- physical distance





#### Ventilation

- Installed 2 portable air purifiers in every classroom
- Acquired 1,000 more Air Purifier units for smaller instructional areas
- Purchased 250 larger Air Purifier units for cafeterias, libraries and large group rooms
- Updating HVAC control systems
- Running HVAC on occupied mode 24/7 to get more fresh air in the buildings
- Upgraded to the higher MERV filters
- Replaced carpet with tiles in 200 classrooms over the summer





# Stay Home When Sick and Get Tested

Any students or staff experiencing COVID-19 symptoms should stay home and be tested.

- Symptoms:
  - Fever or chills
  - Cough
  - Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
  - Fatigue
  - Muscle or body aches
  - Headache
  - New loss of taste or smell
  - Sore throat
  - Congestion or running nose
  - Nausea or vomiting
  - Diarrhea






### **Contact Tracing**


