The District will continue to utilize the Standard Response Protocol as our emergency operations platform and we will continue our partnership with the State University of New York, College at Oswego to assist us in providing training for students and staff and will continue to complete surveys to assess future safety training needs.

Our objectives include providing a safe and supporting environment for all, to leverage cost effective safety solutions and technology, while treating all persons with courtesy, professionalism and respect. As a department of public safety, we are committed to working closely with our community, support organizations, local law enforcement and public safety agencies, to solicit input to provide us with direction and transparency.

As you are aware, the District Safety Plan consists of three active components, which receive annual updates:

The District Code of Conduct, Character and Support; District Emergency Response Plan; District Safety Action Plan.
