T. Roberts Language and Literature classes will use language to better understand themselves and the world around them. They will explore other ways of thinking, become critical, literate, creative, and lifelong readers, writers, listeners, and speakers.

- Language and literature will be taught in English. It is the language of instruction for all courses, except those taught in our Language Aquisition Department.
- All students are required to participate in an English Language Arts class every year of enrollment.
- The Syracuse City School District Language and Literature curriculum is aligned to the NYS standards and the IB written curriculum required components.

Language Acquisition:

Language Acquisition taught at school: Spanish (MYP) and American Sign Language (PYP/MYP)

The world language instruction at J.T. Roberts School is American Sign Language (PYP and MYP) and Spanish (MYP). Fluent-signing ASL teachers provide Primary Years Students (K – 6) with 40 minutes of ASL instruction every six days and is a requirement to fulfill the Language Aquisition subject area. Fluent- speaking Spanish teachers will provide Middle Years students (6-8) with three to five hours of Spanish or ASL Instruction weekly. Language Acquisition instruction supports the IB concept of international mindedness and development of the attributes of the IB Learner Profile. The student of language involves the study of and appreciation for other cultures and perspectives. This awareness will allow our students to view the world as a collection of people from different experiences; students will know that citizens of our country have a unique place in the world. The study of language, culture, and geography begins with our year 1 students and will be carried into high school with specific language courses offered up to and including grade 12.

Language skills are fundamental to the appreciation of global citizenship. As John. T Roberts becomes a more multi-cultural campus, students identified as multilingual are being recognized and welcomed. Students are encouraged to share their language knowledge and culture with the school community through classroom and school-wide events.

Native Language:

The language learned first and/or the language identified as the primary language spoken at home. We believe that recognizing and supporting our students' native language is crucial to their development. The role of parents is vital in ensuring a positive approach to the development of languages. Appropriate support with English at home, as well as the students home language, is an essential part of student's success both in English and non- English-speaking families.

English Language Learners at John T. Roberts will be supported by:
