



### **Foundation Aid Phase-In**

- Phase-in Foundation Aid amount remaining is \$4.3 billion Statewide
- For Syracuse the phase-in represents \$41 million dollars

Regents proposal is for 3 year full phasein, which would yield about \$14 million a year for Syracuse.

## Advocacy



### State Aid Ask - Additional \$23.8 Million Includes Transportation Legislation and Bullet Aid of \$4.6 million

#### **New York State Aid for Public Education**

- \$12.0
- Phase-in of Foundation Aid full phase-in would increase Syracuse City School District's annual state aid by \$42 million. We are asking for an increase of at least \$12 this year and continued phase-in
- English Language Learners & Immigrant
   Students increase weighting of ELLs and
   Immigrant students, include existing and
   long-term ELLs
- \$1.2 School Health Services has been flat funded for more than a decade and does not fund even 1/3 of the nursing staff

- Career & Technical Education (CTE) as we continue to grow the CTE program offering in Syracuse, we need funding increased to include 9<sup>th</sup> grade students and the amount of funding increased to reflect current costs
- Payment of Prior Years' Claims SCSD has \$2.5 million in prior year claims pending

 Transportation – Our community has a laser focus on reducing the walk zone for children across the City of Syracuse.
 We are asking for 1.0 Mile all students grades K-8 beginning in January 2018





### Other Legislative Asks & Budget Issues

- Charter School proposed tuition increase would cost an additional \$800 per pupil which adds another \$1.5 million
  - Maintain the existing language on Charter School Tuition
- Flexibility or ability to repurpose After-School funds for transportation
- Community Schools Set-aside give districts the flexibility to use these funds for existing community school programs

- Disconnect state aid payment from implementation of 3012-d APPR requirements by September 2017
- Eliminate Governor's proposal to unilaterally reduce state aid mid-year
- No to November Database Freeze –\$1
  million impact in Charter School
  Transition Aid because in February we
  updated our projection for two new
  charters opening in Syracuse



### **Local Advocacy**

### **Tax Cap Increases**

- A tax increase at the cap in 2015-16 would have added approximately \$1.9 million per year thereafter in school tax revenues
- A tax increase a the cap in 2016-17 would have added approximately \$1.0 million per year thereafter in school tax revenues



### **STAR & Pilots & Land Bank**

- STAR is approximately \$11 million dollars per year, but the school district only receives \$6.5
- City Payment In Lieu of Tax (PILOT)
   Agreements exclude the district and eliminate school taxes for duration of the PILOT
- Land Bank Transactions are still removing more properties from the tax rolls than adding impacting property tax and school tax
- Sales Tax Sharing Agreement expires
   December 2020 SCSD 0.66%
