3:35 – 3:50	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A-Net Summary • Comparison by Grade-Level • Progress of Students by Race 	<p>A-Net Summary:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A net was about 3 weeks ago • Similar in format to NYS testing: MC choice and short response • Yellow represents Syr Latin/Hughes avg and the gray represents all schools in the network who took the assessment • We are average or above average the network • Some grades took a dip in scores • Teachers spent time looking at data to look at individual standards to practice with students

3:50 – 4:00	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • School Climate Survey Results 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Parents completed school climate survey as well as teachers and students in grades 3-5 • We had 103% of the students • We had 115% of the staff fill it out (probably due to staff taking it more than once) <p>Results:</p> <p>-Will look at the term “bullying” and have a conversation with staff students and parents to talk about what actions can be considered bullying</p> <p>-Survey results expressed parent and student concern over bullying happening in the school. More of a concern for Syr. Latin</p> <p>-Students still felt that there are adults they can go to share that they are bullied to resolve it More than 50% felt they are safe in schools</p> <p>Students felt that teachers have high expectations of them and are respectful. They would be excited if they had their teacher again. Over 75% students felt that their teachers care about them. 90% of students felt that teachers give them the support that they need. 72% felt that they belong in school.</p>

		<p>-Students showed concern over other students showing them respectful</p> <p>-Pockets of students</p> <p>-92% students felt that it was important to do well in school</p> <p>-Overall, survey shows students felt supported</p> <p>For staff climate survey: nothing concerning. One thing that was different both parents and staff took ownership for the social/emotional well-being of students</p> <p>-Parents felt that teachers want students to do well in school.</p> <p>- Does the district receive feedback for the survey? Possibly shortening the survey or breaking it up into segments to have more parent participation</p>
