

SECTION VI: HEALTH HAZARD DATA

EFFECTS OF OVEREXPOSURE/EMERGENCY AND FIRST AID PROCEDURES

EYES: Slightly irritating to eyes. For eye contact, flush with a large amount of water for at least 15 minutes. See a physician if irritation persists.

SECTION VII: SPILL, LEAK, AND DISPOSAL PROCEDURES

SMALL SPILLS: Absorb spill on inert material (E.G. sand, earth) and dispose of as waste material in accordance with local, state, and federal law.

LARGE SPILLS: Keep spectators away. Floors may be slippery; use care to avoid falling. Dike and contain spill with inert material (E.G. sand, earth). Transfer liquid to containers for recovery or disposal and solid diking material to separate containers for disposal. Keep spills and cleaning runoff out of sewers and open bodies of water.

WASTE DISPOSAL: Coagulate the emulsion by the stepwise addition of ferric chloride and lime. Remove the clear supernatant liquid and flush to a chemical sewer or drum liquid waste and turn it over to a licensed hazardous waste disposal facility for disposal, landfill, or incinerate the solids and the contaminated diking material according to local, state, and federal regulations.

SECTION VIII: SPECIAL PROTECTION

EYE PROTECTION: Chemical splash goggles (ANSI Z87.1 or approved equivalent).

RESPIRATORY PROTECTION: None required when permissible airborne concentrations are not exceeded. In emergency, use approved positive pressure self-contained breathing device.
