

Heritage language classes offered for Syracuse City School District's multilingual students to promote biliteracy and develop students' home language.




Summer Institute for Language and Culture (K-12)

July 5-August 11

Mon-Thu, First half of day Summer Site: Franklin Elementary

English Language Learners who are new to the United States and the Syracuse City School District community are invited to participate in the Summer Institute for Language and Culture. Students will have opportunities to explore individual identities in their new communities with the goal of fostering a deeper sense of self, stronger peer supports, and connections to their school and wider community. Weekly field trips will create hands-on learning experiences with a capstone project at the end of the program. Each lesson will have a strong English as a New Language component with translanguaging practices to support students' receptive and expressive languages. Following this content in the AM, students enrolled can participate in the Steps to the Seal program in the PM to develop heritage language literacy.
