



## **FAFSA What to Bring Checklist**

## Get your FSA ID before you complete the FAFSA!

• Students, both you and a parent need Federal Student Aid Identification Numbers (FSA IDs) to complete and electronically sign the FAFSA and other federal student aid documents.

Ш	Student's social security number – bring the card to ensure number is correct
	Parents' social security numbers – bring the card to ensure number is correct
	Parents' date of birth
	Student's driver's license number, if student has one
	Student's Permanent Alien Registration Number, if not a U.S. citizen
	Copy of student's 2019 Federal Income Tax Return
	Copy of parents' 2019 Federal Income Tax Return
	Records of student's 2019 untaxed income from these sources:
	<ul> <li>Child support received for any of the student's children; do not include</li> </ul>
	foster care
	<ul> <li>Tax exempt Interest income</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Veterans' non-education benefits (disability, death pension, etc.)</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Money received by or paid on the student's behalf (e.g., bills)</li> </ul>
	Records of parents' 2019 untaxed income from these sources:
	<ul> <li>Child support received for all children. Do not include foster care</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Tax exempt Interest income</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Veterans' non-education benefits (disability, death pension, etc.)</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Untaxed portions of pensions; exclude rollovers</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Untaxed payments to tax deferred pensions and retirement savings plans</li> </ul>
	(on W-2)
	<ul> <li>Untaxed portion of IRA distributions; exclude rollovers</li> </ul>
	Untaxed portion of IRA deductions
	<ul> <li>Housing, food and other living allowances pd. to members of the military,</li> </ul>
	clergy & others
	Workers' compensation benefits
_	<ul> <li>Disability benefits</li> </ul>
	FSA ID
_	Student and one parent
	An email address – required to reset your FSA ID should you forget it
