# CONDITIONS AND TERMS FOR NYSED-APPROVED CTE PROGRAMS INITIALLY APPROVED 2025

### **Administrative Requirements**

Commissioner's Regulations 100.5(d)(6)(iv)(a) require NYSED-approved CTE programs include the following elements:

- a technical and academic curriculum that achieves the commencement level of the appropriate New York State learning standards for all courses in the career and technical education program, including integrated and/or specialized English, mathematics, science, economics and government, and faculty with State certification in appropriate academic and/or technical subjects;
- a three-part technical assessment that includes an industry developed written and performance component, and a locally developed student project or demonstration of technical skills;
- postsecondary articulation agreements;
- work-based learning opportunities available for students;
- a work skills employability profile to document student attainment of technical knowledge, work-related skills, endorsements and licenses; and
- an assurance that data on student progress and performance will be made available (i.e., reported to the state's Student Information Repository System) to evaluate success on Regent's examinations or approved alternatives, technical assessments, and placement in employment, the military or postsecondary education programs.

<sup>\*</sup>Any issues identified by the Office of CTE must be resolved immediately. Failure to receive program reapproval from the Office of CTE by September 30, 2031, will result in a lapse in the program. Lapsed programs will be removed from the NYSED-approved list and in NYSED's Information Reporting Services' Level 2 data, resulting in student CTE data being blocked from SIRS reporting. These lapsed programs are not considered to be active, and therefore, they are not eligible to award the 4+1 CTE Pathway, integrated/specialized academic credit, and the technical endorsement beyond the 2030-31 school year.

To comply with Commissioner's Regulations and the Regents Policy on CTE Program Approval, NYSED-approved CTE program providers must also adhere to the following conditions and terms.

- Notice of offering integrated and specialized academics: Programs may be approved for
  integrated and specialized academics through the CTE approval process. New York State
  education policy requires that specialized units of credit be approved by each local school
  superintendent or designee where the academic credit will be awarded. Please share the
  approved integrated and specialized academics offered in this program with your component
  districts.
- 2. CTE data reporting: Each year, districts, charter schools, and BOCES are required to collect and report data to the NYSED Office of Information Reporting Services (IRS) through the Student Information Repository System (SIRS). The CTE data collected in SIRS is governed by federal mandates, as some CTE programming receives federal funding from the Strengthening Career and Technical Education for the 21st Century Act (Perkins V). CTE reporting requirements are the same for all schools, whether or not they use Perkins funding directly.

All providers of CTE courses must report to the Course Instructor Assignment, Student Class Entry Exit, and Student Class Grade Detail templates. All NYSED-approved CTE program providers must also report to the Programs Fact, Assessment Fact, and the Student Lite templates. CTE providers are responsible for establishing their own internal data collection methods.

CTE data should be reported by the program provider—the agency that operates the NYSED-approved CTE program. This change does not remove the need for districts and BOCES to share CTE data for other purposes (e.g. the generation of transcripts and awarding of credits). Guidance on reporting data to the Department via the SIRS Level 2 data warehouse can be found on the <a href="Student Information Repository System">Student Information Repository System</a> (SIRS) Guidance webpage. Post high school placement data is the only CTE data element that is reported outside of the SIRS. NYSED-approved CTE program providers must annually complete and submit a 3S1 post high school placement report to the Office of CTE. Guidance on reporting 3S1 post high school placement data to the Office of CTE can be found on the <a href="Post-Program Placement Data">Post-Program Placement Data</a> (3S1) webpage.

3. Awarding of technical endorsements: Students who successfully complete a NYSED-approved CTE program, including passing each part of the 3-part technical assessment, may be awarded a technical endorsement. The technical endorsement is imprinted on a seal to be affixed to the diploma and includes the phrase Career and Technical Endorsement. The NYSED does not provide the actual seal; this must be obtained locally. Please contact the Office of CTE for a sample endorsement seal that has been developed by the New York State Education Department (NYSED). Program providers who offer shared program services need to notify component districts of students who have completed all approved program requirements and earned the technical endorsement.

- 4. Use of the 4+1 CTE pathway: Students who successfully complete a NYSED-approved CTE program, including passing each part of the 3-part technical assessment, may use their completion of the program as an approved pathway to meet graduation requirements under the "4+1" pathway assessment option. The 4+1 Career and Technical Education (CTE) pathway can be utilized once a student has met the minimum diploma requirements of 22 credits, passed the four required Regents exams (one in each of the following subjects: English language arts, mathematics, science, and social studies), and successfully completed a NYSED-approved CTE program. Program providers who offer shared program services need to notify component districts of students who have completed all approved program requirements and may utilize the 4+1 CTE pathway.
- 5. **Amendments:** Any changes to a NYSED-approved CTE program (e.g. program content, technical assessment, program faculty, etc.) must be requested and approved through an amendment form prior to the change being implemented in the program of study. Amendments can be filed at any point during the five-year approval period. Amendments are designed for minor changes that do not substantially impact the overall program intent. Substantial changes may not be made through amendments and may require a re-approval application. For assistance in determining if a change is substantial, please contact the Office of CTE.
- 6. Maintaining program approval: NYSED-approved CTE programs are approved for a five-year period. To maintain approval, program providers must complete and submit a re-approval application by the June 30 program expiration date. Clarifications requested by the Office of CTE must be resolved by the program provider to obtain program re-approval. Failure to receive program re-approval from the Office of CTE by September 30 will result in a lapse in the program. Lapsed programs will be removed from the NYSED-approved list and in NYSED's Information Reporting Services' Level 2 data, resulting in student CTE data being blocked from SIRS reporting. These lapsed programs are not considered to be active, and therefore, they are not eligible to award the 4+1 CTE Pathway, integrated/specialized academic credit, and the technical endorsement beyond the program expiration date.
