The self-study is an important step in the career and technical education approval process and provides for an in-depth evaluation of the program of study. Its purpose is to bring together primarily internal stakeholders to review the CTE program and propose relevant modifications.

# **Program Information**

Cosmetology is a four-year program in which students will prepare for licensure in New York State and a career in the Appearance Enhancement field. The Cosmetology program is taught in a stateof-the-art salon setting where students will engage in many handson services such as haircutting, hairstyling, coloring, chemical texture service, and manicuring, pedicuring and skin care.

In addition to hands-on skills, students will learn about cosmetology through written work, lectures, guest speakers, group discussions, group activities and science based lab work. Daily class attendance is required and a crucial part of the preparation for licensure. Through this program students will also develop patience, perseverance, communication, and customer service skills as well as time management strategies that are needed to be successful in the field of cosmetology.

New York State requires all people working in the Appearance Enhancement field to be licensed before performing services on a client. At the successful completion of the four-year program, students will qualify for a New York State Temporary Cosmetology License and become eligible to take the New York State Licensing Exam in Cosmetology. To be eligible, candidates must be at least 17 years old, have 1,000 hours of classroom instruction and a final overall passing grade of 70%. The New York State Licensing Exam in Cosmetology exam consists of a 100-question multiple choice test and a practical hands-on test.

The Career Field: Cosmetology Involves the science of improving beauty through the care and treatment of nails, skin, and hair Cosmetologists provide a variety of nail services which include manicuring, pedicuring, gel poish, nail tips, and acrylic application. They also provide services in skin care such as waxing, facials, and makeup. The hair services offered by a Cosmetologist include hair cutting, styling, chemical texture services, and hair coloring. Cosmetologists also understand the importance of quality service, organization, teamwork and exceptional communication skills when working in this career field.

The Program: As a student in the 4-year Cosmetology pathway at Public Service Leadership Academy, you will be propared for a career in the beauty enhancement tield. 



# Post-Secondary Articulation Agreement

Our Cosmetology program has articulation agreements with Onondaga Community College, and Bryant and Stratton College

Articulation Agreement between Syracuse City School District (SCSD) 725 Harrison St, Syracuse, NY **Onondaga Community College** 4585 West Seneca Tumpike, Syracuse, NY

The signatories of this articulation agreement, Syracuse City School District (SCSD) and Onondaga Community College (OCC), declare their Intention to participate in a partnership for the purpose of delivering educational instruction to eligible students. The parties to this agreement have reached the following understanding:

- The term of this agreement shall be for five years from July 1, 2023 June 30, 2028 and subject to the following conditions:
- Both parties have the option to extend this Agreement for one (1) additional five-year period giving written notice to the College no later than ninety (90) days prior to the expiration date
- 2. Modification and Walver No waiver or modifications shall be valid unless it is in writing and signed by OCC and SCSD
- 3. Curriculum and Courses
  - · Students who have enrolled in the Cosmetology program at Syracuse City School District will be eligible to enroll in courses and earn credit for:
    - ENG 103 and ENG 104: Freshman Composition and Literature I and II, subject to an annual Memorandum of Understanding and the Identification of an OCC faculty member to teach the course onpremises at the Public Service Leadership Academy; and;
    - BUS 102: Mathematics of Business & Finance, through the Onondaga Community College, College Credit Now Program, subject to an annual Memorandum of Understanding and the availability of a credentialed high school instructor or an OCC faculty member to teach the course on-premises at the Public Service Leadership Academy
- · The above courses offered through the OCC College Credit Now Program are required for the Business Technology, A.A.S. degree at OCC.
- · Tultion for concurrent enrollment courses will be incurred according to all applicable requirements in place by the State University of New York. For courses taught by Onondaga Community College faculty, the Syracuse City School District will additionally incur the cost set by annual Memorandum of Understanding between SCSD and OCC.
- · Students will be assisted in the course registration process by OCC. Students will also be supported in the admission process to Onondaga Community College through a specialized workshop and the Office of Student Recruitment
